edoc is designed to transform the way businesses record what happens to the waste they produce or handle. It will do away with burdensome and outdated paper waste transfer notes, saving time, effort and money in fulfilling the legal duty of care for waste.

Developed by a partnership of waste industry and UK public bodies, edoc is safe and secure, and it is free to use. Waste transfer records will be confidential to the parties directly involved. They will be stored electronically for the full two years required by law - or longer if needed. And users have instant access to smart search and reporting tools that can transform the kind of data once locked up in millions of paper documents into valuable business information at the click of a mouse.
